

# Directions — Where Is It?

## Lesson Objectives

- Read a story about giving directions
- Use turn left, turn right, go straight
- Use next to, opposite, between
- Ask 'Excuse me, where is...?'
- Write directions to a place

## Part 1: Reading — Finding the Library

Finn is new in town. He wants to go to the library but doesn't know the way. He asks a police officer.

"Excuse me, where is the library?" "Go straight along this road. Walk past the bakery on your left. Then you see a park on your right."

"At the traffic lights, turn left into Oak Street. Go straight for two minutes. You see a supermarket on the corner."

"The library is next to the supermarket. It's opposite the post office and between the supermarket and a cafe."

Finn follows the directions. He finds the library! He gets a library card and borrows three books.

On the way home, a girl asks: "Where is the park?" Finn helps: "Go straight and turn right. The park is on your left." Finn knows the town now!

Is there a park near here?	Turn right at the corner.
How do I get to the school?	Walk past the shop. On your left.
