Part 1: Reading — A Nature Walk

Class 3 goes on a nature walk to Bluebell Forest. It is sunny.

"I can see a butterfly!" says Ella. "I can hear a bird singing!" says Tom. There are tall trees with green leaves and flowers.

They walk next to a river. "There are fish in the river!" says Jake. "There is a frog on that rock!" says Amy. "Animals need clean water," says Miss Taylor.

In a big field, there are bees on the flowers. "Bees help flowers grow," says Miss Taylor.

They find rubbish on the ground — plastic bottles and bags. "This is bad for the environment. We should pick up rubbish."

The children collect the rubbish. "We should recycle, save water, and plant trees," says Miss Taylor.

"Let's look after our planet!" Every child plants a seed in the school garden.
