

# Let's Go Shopping!

## What You Will Learn

## Part 1: Shopping Words

Word	Meaning
<b>shop/store</b>	place to buy things
<b>shopping centre</b>	big building, many shops
<b>price</b>	how much it costs
<b>receipt</b>	paper showing what you paid
<b>pay</b>	give money
<b>change</b>	money you get back
<b>cheap</b>	doesn't cost much
<b>expensive</b>	costs a lot
<b>sale/discount</b>	lower price
<b>try on</b>	check if clothes fit
<b>size</b>	small, medium, large
<b>shopping bag</b>	bag for your items

Types of shops: bookshop, clothes shop, bakery, toy shop, supermarket, sports shop, electronics shop, pet shop

## Part 2: Reading — A Day at the Shopping Centre

Mia had 30 pounds of birthday money. She was very excited!

Bookshop: "How much is this book?" — "8 pounds. Buy one, get one half price!" Mia bought two books for 12 pounds. "Cheaper than buying separately!"

Clothes shop: Mia tried on three pairs of trainers. First = too small. Second = too big. Third = perfect! "How much are these?" — "25 pounds." Too expensive! But they're in the sale — only 15 pounds! She had 3 pounds left.

Bakery: "Can I have a chocolate croissant?" — "2 pounds." Mia paid 3 pounds, got 1 pound change. Mum bought bread and cupcakes.

Result: 2 books + trainers + croissant = 29 pounds spent, 1 pound left. "I'm the best bargain hunter!" Mum laughed.

Comprehension: 1) Birthday money? 30 pounds. 2) Both books? 12 pounds. 3) First 2 trainers? Too small, too big. 4) Sale price? 15 pounds. 5) Bakery? Chocolate croissant. 6) Money left? 1 pound. 7) Mum called her? Best bargain hunter.

### Part 3: Shopping Language

Prices: How much is this? (singular) / How much are these? (plural)

Buying: Can I have...? / I'd like... / I'll take it!

Trying on: Can I try this on? / Do you have a bigger/smaller size?

Not buying: No thanks, I'm just looking.

Customer	Shop Assistant
How much is this?	It's 15 pounds.
Can I have this, please?	Of course! Anything else?
Do you have a bigger size?	Let me check... Yes!
Can I try this on?	Sure! Fitting room is there.
I'll take it!	That's 15 pounds, please.
Here you are. (money)	Here's your change and receipt.

- J:** Thanks! I'm going to score lots of goals!

*Example: Last Saturday, I went to the shopping centre. First, I went to the bookshop. I asked, 'How much is this?' — '6 pounds.' I bought it because it was cheap! Then, the clothes shop. I tried on a blue jacket but it was too expensive — 40 pounds! Finally, the bakery. 'Can I have a doughnut?' Only 1.50 and delicious! I love shopping days!*
