## Explanations

- A** — This is a spontaneous decision made at the moment of speaking, so we use 'will' ('ll).
- C** — This is a plan already made, so we use 'going to'.
- B** — For predictions based on opinion (I think...), we use 'will'.
- D** — There is visible evidence (dark clouds), so we use 'going to' for this prediction.
- A** — This is a promise/offer made at the moment, so we use 'will' ('ll).
- C** — She has already decided and made arrangements, so we use 'going to'.
- B** — We use 'Will you...?' to make a polite request.
- D** — They have a plan and have made arrangements, so we use 'going to'.
- A** — For promises, we use 'will'. The negative is 'won't' (will not).
- C** — There is evidence (he studied hard), so we use 'going to' for this prediction.
- B** — Answering the phone is a spontaneous decision made right now, so we use 'will' ('ll).
- D** — The barbecue is already planned, so we use 'going to'.
- A** — This is a plan/intention for the future, so we use 'going to' (I'm going to be).
- C** — This is a spontaneous offer, so we use 'will' ('ll).
- B** — She has a plan and has been preparing, so we use 'going to'.
- D** — With 'I think / I don't think', we use 'will' for predictions based on opinion.
- A** — The question form of 'going to' is: Are + subject + going to + verb.
- C** — There is evidence (we're late), so we use 'going to' for this prediction.
- B** — This is a spontaneous decision made right now, so we use 'will' ('ll).
- D** — The wedding is planned and arranged, so we use 'going to'.
- A** — Ordering food in a restaurant is a spontaneous decision, so we use 'will' (I'll have...).

- 22. C** — The correct form is: is + going to + base verb. 'She is going to take'.
- 23. B** — This is a promise, so we use 'will'. 'I will call you tomorrow'.
- 24. D** — The correct form needs the right 'be' verb: I'm going to, he's going to, they're going to. Only D is correct.
- 25. A** — He already bought paint, so this is a prior plan/intention. We use 'going to'.
- 26. C** — For general predictions about the future (no specific evidence), we use 'will'.
- 27. B** — There is visible evidence that the person might drop them, so we use 'going to'.
- 28. A** — We use 'Shall I...?' to make a polite offer to help someone.
- 29. D** — He has already decided not to come (a plan), so we use 'not going to'.
- 30. B** — With 'I think', we use 'will' for a prediction based on opinion.
